RESOLUTION #2022-8 – COOPERATIVE PRICING SYSTEM MEMBERSHIP

Motion to approve made by Commissioner D'Arminio; 2nd by Chairman Stassi.

ED Feorenzo: This is to join a Cooperative Purchasing Agreement allowing HHA to have fixed pricing from different vendors that apply to the State instead of pricing when HHA goes out to bid on items. A hot water heater went down @ 65 First Street; with approval of Commissioners I got a temporary hot water boiler out in our parking lot – with emergency service. There is a tractor-trailer in parking lot, but is not a fix. It costs \$2,000/week for fuel to keep boiler running outside. I spoke with vendor that came in; there is a cooperative agreement with the State. HHA can get 2 boilers for less money and quicker time, if HHA joins this Association. It will not only eliminate bidding process/we will get better prices and have it done in 4-5 weeks instead of 10-15 weeks. There are also other services HHA can purchase, saving HHA money in long run. I discussed with Quality Purchasing Agent; he agrees and other towns also do this – Cliffside Park/Edgewater and claim to be useful and resourceful.

Now we put it out to bid for 2 years; company who has been doing it, always lowest bidder is CHUTES PLUS; doing a great job; came with same numbers we've been paying; no one bids against them. Six months cleaning helps prevent roaches from going in; we do spray chutes for roaches; power washing it, keep clean and sanitary.

MANAGEMENT REPORT & UNFINISHED BUSINESS

ED Feorenzo: <u>Police Report:</u> There were 16 medical calls this month; no criminal activities – no drugs, no arrests on property; no complaints.

<u>65 First Street</u> – everyone aware of hot water boiler that blew. In joining the co-op, everything will be sent to co-op tomorrow and get State approval next week to get permanent fix for this. Instead of having (inaudible due to train whistle) HHA will have more updated system – 2 boilers with 2 holding tanks in case one goes out/high efficiency and we'd still have hot water. Boiler now at 65 First Street was put in 20 years ago; 1 big boiler repaired a few times. Quicker it is done, the more money HHA will save - \$2,000/week plus fuel – fuel averaging \$200/week as it does not run continuously. It is filled up every 3rd day. Only thing boiler does is run hot water. 65 First Street is electric tea tack (ph.) heaters, no hot water boiler heaters there.

<u>164 Beech Street</u> – holding tank is 500 gallons, been repaired a few times in past. 2 big cracks cannot be repaired; it was drained. We already had the fix. ED Feorenzo took two 100 gallon holding tanks, put them next to boilers, and so if one goes down, there is still another tank. They all have close-off valves, so 1 boiler can be isolated if it goes down.

<u>Waiting List Report</u> – update next month. Possibility that in May/June it might be opened just for 4-bedroom family units; better grip on it next month.

ED Feorenzo thanked Commissioners for allowing him to move forward in joining co-op and getting 65 First Street emergency boiler up and running – all said just get it done.

OLD BUSINESS

Commissioner Stuart asked about Fair Share Housing Agreement – there is a court hearing at end of March. ED Feorenzo has heard nothing yet and waiting to hear from City.

NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Stuart reported Access Community Development has been delivering meals to seniors; getting ready to go into another portion of a grant, but limited to 50 people per unit. Is it possible to get names so that they can be provided to County when food is being delivered? ED Feorenzo will send out flyers to seniors, but half will not respond, but will try. 164 Beech and 175 W. Railroad have 60 and 48 units, but not fair to Kansas Street and 65 First Street. I will put flyer out to people. Commissioner Stuart: Initially, 150 to Kansas Street and 75 to 65 First, 50 to Railroad/Beech. ED Feorenzo: Tenants did not come down, sometimes doors were knocked on. Can HHA put flyers out that there will be meals – first come/first serve at whatever time it's going to be. Dave and Carmine will probably have to knock on doors to get rid of 50 meals. Commissioner Stuart will get back to ED Feorenzo.
